Prerequisites:

It is your responsibility to ensure that you have met any prerequisites required to earn credit for this course. Refunds will not be issued outside of the refund policy because prerequisites were not met prior to enrolling or taking the course.

Objective of the Course:

The main objective of this class is for students to get a complete experience in literature, writing, research and critical thinking based on the Common Core Content Standards. Students will work to gain a better understanding of the different types of literature. In addition, students will be writing essays (both formal and personal), creating class presentations and other projects, reviewing grammar and punctuation rules, and increasing their vocabulary.

Discussion Board: Discussion boards are the online equivalent of class discussion. You are required to submit discussion board posts for this course. Involvement in discussion must be evident; this requires multiple original comments on a given topic. The questions/topics are already presented in the Discussion Board area. There is no exact right or wrong answer on discussion board questions; it is meant to be a forum for ideas, discussion, argument and opinion.

You should explain and justify your comments clearly and reply to others' comments. I will comment on your posts, as well. Your participation in each discussion board will combine to count as one test grade for the course.

Exams: This course will have four exams. They will heavily emphasize vocabulary, as key terms are vital to the understanding of the concepts presented. Grammar and composition skills learned and practiced in each lesson will also be part of the grading rubric for each exam. No supplementary materials (notes, textbooks, reference books, etc.) can be used. We reserve the right to require any student to come to the High School Online office to take or redo any test. Academic dishonesty will not be tolerated and can result in an F in the course.

Project: Projects are required to be submitted through Moodle. It is the student's responsibility to ensure the material is submitted successfully.

Grades: You will receive a numerical grade for each lesson that you submit. The project grade will be included in the lesson grade. Your lesson grades will count as 1/3 of your final, and your tests will count as 2/3 of your final grade. As lessons and tests are graded, your grade will be posted in Moodle. While I strive to grade your lessons and tests in a very timely fashion, please note that there are certain times when there may be a delay in grading (holidays, weekends, etc.)

Final Grade: Once you have submitted all assignments for grading and your final average is calculated a completion letter will be mailed to the student and the school. The school will issue the letter grade and add the course to your transcript.
